- **Science Camp: August 20th to the 24th.** Be a scientist for the week and explore the magic of chemistry and physics with a little earth and space science thrown in for good measure!




Third Coast Conversations: Talking all things "WATER"

The National Endowment for the Humanities has awarded Raven Hill Discovery Center \$5,000 for the grant program entitled "Third Coast Conversations". The grant will support a series of statewide public conversations taking place in 20 communities over two years that focus on the cultural, social, historical, and environmental factors that connect Michigan's people to their water. The project will be led by the Michigan Humanities in collaboration with their strong network of partner organizations across the state, including Raven Hill. The Third Coast Conversations project will take place during 2019 and 2020 and Raven Hill will focus on the role of water in shaping Michigan's human history. The Center's staff will attend a training this May with Adam Davis, Executive Director of the Oregon Humanities. Adam is revered across the country as the "guru" of community conversations and will assist participants with planning strong community dialogues about Water in Michigan.

Deer Creek Project

The Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) has approved Raven Hill Discovery Center's application to build a boardwalk and platform along Deer Creek at the Center's new Open Space. The boardwalk and platform is located on land that was acquired in 2017, giving the Center access to both sides of Deer Creek. Deer Creek is used by Raven Hill in several of its educational programs, most especially with its middle school career expo for water quality studies and during summer camps. The new boardwalk and platform will allow access to the creek away from Fuller Road, addressing current safety concerns for the younger campers. Little Traverse Conservancy will oversee the construction of the boardwalk and platform. Lowe's has generously offered to provide both materials and labor for the project.



Luke Buck Watercolor Workshop

Luke Buck, watercolor artist, returns to Raven Hill for a 10th year to present a watercolor workshop. The workshop is scheduled for Thursday, June 28th and Friday, June 29th from 10am to 3pm each day. Cost is \$275 and lunch is furnished. In collaboration with the national "Smithsonian Museum on Main Street Water/Ways" exhibit that Raven Hill is hosting this summer, Luke has chosen the study of "Waterways in Watercolor" for the theme of the watercolor workshop this year. Using Luke's unique technique in transparent watercolor and gouache, the group will study painting landscape scenes depicting water in different forms, like lakes, streams, or waterfalls. The workshop is designed for the novice beginner, intermediate, or the more advanced & accomplished watercolor artist. Luke Buck, a native "Hoosier", grew up and studied art in Indiana. His nostalgic paintings of Americana landscapes and American wildlife show a love for life, art, and nature. Many "locals" here in northern Michigan appreciate his talents and enjoy collecting his paintings.



FREE Second Saturdays Continue


