New York, New York



As Frank Sinatra so aptly put it in his famous song, "These little town blues are melting away..." East Jordan arrives in the Big Apple.

Today's technology compresses distance to almost nothing, creating a seamless

experience where we can watch, listen, and interact with events happening on the other side of the country or world as they unfold. It's like comparing a snail's pace to a lightning bolt. This was evidenced by guests' experiences Friday at the Smithsonian Gathering in East Jordan as they watched local students at the Cooper Hewitt, Smithsonian Design Museum in New York City. Modern communication is astonishingly fast, making it feel like we're almost *there* with just a click AND this time, fourteen of us really were in New York, including teacher, Angela Berrera!

Last year, East Jordan middle/high school Spanish students, along with other northern Michigan students, participated in an innovation design project sponsored by Cooper Hewitt, Smithsonian Design Museum. The **Youth Innovation in Rural America (YIRA)** projects were all about bridging the gap between creative design principles and novel solutions. The 2023 East Jordan Spanish class's **YIRA** project was chosen to be part of Cooper Hewitt's **Making Home—Smithsonian Design Triennial** exhibition. Recently, the Smithsonian invited EJ students to attend the **Making Home** opening to see their work. That, in turn, led to Friday night's livestream. The Star Trek phrase "beam us up" perfectly describes our streaming experience—bringing East Jordan Spanish students' experiences at the Cooper Hewitt in Manhattan back to their hometown audience of family and friends in East Jordan and hinting at the futuristic atmosphere surrounding innovation design exploration.
