(Above right) Two poles are used to control the smoke flap vent at the top of the tipi. In the daylight hours, the vent would be open for lighting and when building a new fire. (Right) Look for this tipi, also tepee or teepee, at Raven Hill next summer. Traditionally covered with animal skins over the wooden poles, modern tipis usually have a canvas covering. Historically, the tipi was used by the Indigenous people of the Plains of North America. Early in Raven Hill's history, Lola Greatwalker and her 5 kids stayed in a tipi at the Center, while Lola taught classes for us.
