Smithsonian Collaboration in the "Works" for 2020: Labor Days

Raven Hill Discovery Center has been selected to participate in a Smithsonian pilot project to develop a unique humanities-based exhibition about local work history. The project will allow Raven Hill staff and volunteers to learn about the exhibition development process used by the Smithsonian's Museum on Main Street (MoMS) program. The Center is one of only ten in the United States to be chosen for this pilot project. Participating sites include Pikeville, Kentucky; Haverhill, Massachusetts; Blytheville, Arkansas; Globe, Arizona; Grinnell, Iowa; Meridian, Mississippi; Aurora, Nebraska; Troy, New York; Lyons, Kansas and Raven Hill.

The national overview for the exhibition will be provided by the Smithsonian and will be completed by Raven Hill using local historical images, art and artifacts, video clips and oral histories. The resulting exhibition will reflect the strong history and culture of work around Lake Charlevoix and connections to work in northern Michigan, the nation and around the world. The highlight was packaging a raw egg to simulate a lunar module landing on the moon's surface. Visitors then watched

August was the month to "Get Active" and an exhibit from August 1 to 21 featured the *Physics of Motion*. Posters illustrated topics like speed, flexibility, agility and balance, highlighting both suggestions for improving and the sporting relevance for each. 
