Campers created marbled paper, Shibori handkerchiefs, mosaics and paper weaving, among other two-dimensional art projects as a focal point of each day's session.

By Wednesday, things were really going strong. Not only was Discovery Camp still in session, but the Luke Buck Watercolor workshop filled the Great Room with artists of all ability levels. This was Luke's 12th year instructing a two-day watercolor workshop here at Raven Hill. This session's subject was old barns, which was of particular interest to many of the participants.

Barns are also a great segue into the upcoming *Labor Days: History of Work* exhibit that opens August 14th here at Raven Hill. Raven Hill Discovery Center is collaborating with the

Smithsonian's Museum on Main Street (MoMS) program in a pilot project about the history of who, where, why and how we work. Chosen in 2019 as one of only ten organizations in the entire United States to work with Smithsonian staff to create the exhibit: *Labor Days*, the exhibit will chronicle the diversity of work in northern Lower Michigan over the past 150 years and will parallel that with the variety of work done in the rest of Michigan, the nation and around the world during that same time period.

The museum itself was active with visitors much of the week! Visitors explored indoors, held the animals and then moved outdoors, dodging rain storms to enjoy the Music Garden, Jurassic Park Walk, Schoolhouse, new Tipi, Treehouse and Ancient World. Predictably, the Schoolhouse, Treehouse and Pyramid remain everyone's favorites.
