Raven Hill is pleased to be chosen by Michigan Humanities to host a new Smithsonian Museum on Main Street Exhibit, **Spark! Places of Innovation**. The exhibit will tour Michigan during



2023. *Spark!* will explore the unique combination of places, people and circumstances that sparks innovation and invention in rural communities. Inspired by an exhibition at the National Museum of American History, this travelling exhibition features stories gathered from diverse communities across the nation. Jennifer Rupp, President & CEO of Michigan Humanities said, "It was very difficult to narrow down from 18 applications to six host sites." In addition to Raven Hill, Alpena County George N. Fletcher Public Library, Three Rivers Public Library, Benzonia Public Library, Capac Library/St. Clair County Library System and Loutit District Library in Grand Haven will host the *Spark! Places of Innovation* Exhibit.

In addition, the Smithsonian's Museum on Main Street (MoMS) program is working with the Cooper Hewitt Smithsonian Design Museum (CHSDM) on a **Youth Innovation in Rural America** (**YIRA**) project. Raven Hill has

been invited to submit an application. Only two communities out of about 24 sites in four states will be selected to participate in the **YIRA** project. **YIRA** will provide an intensive program for young people that uses principles of design to demonstrate how innovation can turn community problems into real solutions.

Inspired by *Spark!*, which highlights innovation in rural America from the perspective of the people who lived it, students in grades 7-12 will participate in a community-based design challenge. Youth will play a leading role in brainstorming and identifying the unique problems faced by their community, during neighborhood conversations and interviews. This input will in turn determine their final project focus. Concurrent with the students' process, the host community benefits from encouraging public discourse and enhancing youth involvement as a way to inspire innovation within the community. Cooper Hewitt, Museum on Main Street and Michigan Humanities partners are excited to bring the new **Youth Innovation in Rural America** program to states hosting the *Spark!* Exhibit and Raven Hill is excited to submit an application.
