Greetings Everyone!

Soon after Raven Hill opened in 1992, an **Edge Trail** was established for visitors to explore the "edge" habitat between the woods and open fields. The half-mile walking pathway meandered around the large field north of the Schoolhouse.

In 2006, fifteen years ago, with financial support from the Charlevoix County Community Foundation, the Michigan Department of Natural Resources and the Bay Harbor Foundation, Raven Hill re-purposed the **Edge Trail** as the **Taxonomic** or **Taxi Trail**. Trees were planted along the trail by their family evolution, starting with the primitive pines all the way to the more modern trees, like fruit trees.

Shadowboxes were installed with signs to identify each of the 24 tree families and displays of how those trees were or are used. We collected authentic items and miniatures to illustrate food, medicinal, shelter, transportation and other uses.



These signs can be found at each end of the **Taxi Trail** and show a few traditional uses of wood, like ash for baseball bats and oak for furniture. Do you have a favorite wood?

The original **Taxi Trail** displays with the actual objects could not withstand the rigors of northern Michigan weather and were recently removed, leaving only the tree family name. The **Taxi Trail** shadowboxes will soon display new weatherproof, full-color panels, showcasing the name and uses of each tree family, as part of the planned **Connections Trail** project.

The **Connections Trail** and its 40 learning stations, along with the parallel & updated **Taxi Trail** will meet Raven Hill's mission, enhance formal education and engage visitor learning with hands-on outdoor experiences. The **Taxi Trail** trees will be visible from the **Connections Trail** & accessible at the same time. With COVID guidelines in place, the hands-on aspect of Raven Hill will move to an open-air setting outdoors, while the inside will house new & favorite visual displays plus limited interactive exhibits.



Birch trees are a familiar site here in northern Michigan. The bark, sap, wood, leaves and twigs were and are useful. The original birch family sign showed actual objects. Someday, those items will be repurposed in an indoor display at Raven Hill.

Raven Hill learned this week that the Charlevoix County Community Foundation Board of Trustees approved a grant to Raven Hill Discovery Center, during their Environment & Land Use grant cycle. The \$5,000 grant award is to help with the construction of Raven Hill's **Connections Trail**. Several of the stations will facilitate learning about and caring for the environment.

Earlier this year, the Baiardi Foundation also pledged \$5,000. We will hear soon about two other **Connections Trail** grant applications that have been submitted and have a fifth application due mid-April. The hard work has already begun for us here at the Center. We are extremely excited about this new outdoor hands-on exhibit. Thank you, Charlevoix County Community Foundation and Baiardi Foundation for partnering once again with Raven Hill to make our mission and vision become a reality for the benefit of Charlevoix and Emmet County residents, as well as the larger audience of visitors who come to experience the Center.

Page 3 of this update includes a new map showing the future **Connections Trail** as it parallels the existing **Taxi Trail**. Look for future updated maps of Raven Hill's Ancient World and Open Space areas!
