Halfway to Anywhere

Thanks to Charlevoix County and Petoskey-Harbor Springs Area Community Foundations, **Halfway to Anywhere:** *Living in Space* will bring a space environment into Charlevoix and Emmet County 5th grade classrooms, strengthening creative and critical thinking skills with challenging hands-on STEM/STEAM activities to simulate living in space. **Halfway to Anywhere** will explore the requirements for oxygen, food, water and shelter for living in the hostile environment on the moon or Mars, or perhaps even here on Earth. With funding in place from the two community foundations, Raven Hill staff will provide three lessons in each participating fifth grade classroom in the two counties. Students will understand photosynthesis and build a hydroponic system as a source of food and oxygen; simulate a recycling system to purify and reuse water; and

Special Fall Exhibit: GENERATIONS

In September of 2019, Raven Hill will host a Generations exhibit. Northwestern Lower Michigan has a rich history of small towns and villages that grew and changed as lumber, agricultural products and the industrial riches of this area were connected through railroads and new roads to more urban areas "downstate." Resort, vacation, sport fishing and skiing businesses followed, further expanding the lure of this area - a region blessed with Lake Michigan, inland lakes and rivers and numerous forests. More recently, the area has become home to orchards, breweries and wineries, bringing the area full circle back to agriculture. Like the Smithsonian's Museum on Main Street, Crossroads: Change in Rural America, Raven Hill Discovery Center's Generations is a chance to highlight for the community the importance of northern Michigan's history through a collection of stories, artifacts, exhibits and structures to be treasured and shared. It is also a time to encourage discussions about the present and future of northwestern Lower Michigan and share conversations about how people are working hard to maintain their small town's pride, culture and "rural" lifestyles, as well as maintain the surrounding natural resources and beauty of this "neck of the woods." 
