Re: Dragonflies, frogs, flowers and treehouses

Artist Kelly Boyle returned to Raven Hill this weekend to focus on individual "garden art" instead of community mural paintings. The Saturday workshop encouraged participants to paint for permanent display outdoors—in their garden, on their garage or wherever! Participants could choose one of her designs to personalize or branch out with their own creation. Boyle demonstrated the steps, shared her techniques and everyone went home at the end of the day with their own piece of garden art.

This informal workshop included beginner, intermediate, and accomplished artists with everyone motivated and inspired by friends and fellow artists.

Gayle Levengood used Raven Hill's Treehouse, which is built in the shape of a maple leaf, as the inspiration for her garden art painting. Thanks to her generosity, the sign will remain at the Center and help visitors find their way along the trail and into the woods to the accessible Treehouse.

Boyle is a Lansing-area print-maker, art teacher and muralist who sees a blank wall as an ideal canvas for expression and community involvement. Her first community mural, "Meridian in Motion," was painted during Meridian Township's annual summer festival in 2016 and involved over 250 community members. "Anyone who wanted to paint was welcome," says Boyle. "We had toddlers, teens, seniors – even a dog!" The mural was designed so that each person could creatively paint his or her own small section.

In 2018, 2019 and 2022, Boyle designed and directed different community art projects right here at Raven Hill Discovery Center. "There's a special energy, when people are painting together – a peaceful, purposeful excitement," she says. "And I love seeing the community's pride in the mural they created." In 2021, Boyle was commissioned to paint two dinosaur panels for the Connections Trail at Raven Hill. This year's artist workshop focused on individual panels. Whether it is a community mural project or individual artist workshop, there is always that same special energy of people painting together – "a peaceful, purposeful excitement".
