Sequencing

To sequence is to put things in order. A timeline is an example of sequencing. So it alphabetizing. You will need a variety of coins to sequence. First look at the coins and think about ways that you could put them in order. For example, you could sequence by size—from large to small OR small to large. Or you could find the dates on all of them and sequence them by date—from old to new OR new to old. Two of the same size or date go under each other in a "column". Think of other things to sequence. For example, you could sequence all the members in your family by age or height! You could sequence all your stuffed animals alphabetically OR by size! You could sequence your matchbox cars alphabetically by the make of the car. You could sequence objects by the rainbow from red to violet OR from violet to red! Use a ruler, if you aren't sure about the diameters or heights and a magnifying glass, if you can't see the dates easily! Put everything away, when you finish. Enjoy!
