Raven Hill Discovery Center remains an interactive science, history and arts museum. It embodies experiential learning by providing users with hands-on activities and exhibits both on site and through outreach programs. Whether at the Center or during traveling programs, participants *engage* directly with exhibits, experiments, and demonstrations, fostering learning through direct experience rather than passive observation. This approach encourages curiosity, exploration, and deeper understanding of scientific, historic and artistic concepts. The hands-on activities and programs at Raven Hill make it a popular destination for groups, families and tourists alike, whether for special viewings of the recent solar eclipse or field trip experiences for schools and scouts.

The Center's traveling outreach programs offer several advantages to users. These programs bring the museum experience to groups that may not have easy access to the onsite programs, making art, history, and science more accessible to a wider audience. Raven Hill Outreach programs feature interactive activities and demonstrations, which enhance learning and *engagement* with the Center's mission and themes, whether exploring STEM careers or enjoying the

reptiles. By reaching out to schools, libraries, and community centers, Raven Hill builds strong ties with local communities, fostering relationships and promoting cultural appreciation. Traveling programs provide educational opportunities for students outside the traditional classroom setting, offering hands-on learning

experiences that complement school curriculums right on the school or library site. Outreach programs help reach new audiences and raise awareness about the Center's offerings, potentially attracting more visitors to Raven Hill itself. Overall, Raven Hill Discovery Center's Outreach programs serve as a valuable tool for fulfilling the mission of providing a place where science, history and art connect, involving diverse audiences and promoting cultural understanding.

Raven Hill is continuously expanding and improving to provide *engaging* experiences for visitors of all ages. The Center offers and **maintains** a diverse range of facilities and exhibits for visitors to explore, from the main Museum to outdoor attractions like the Jurassic Park walkway. This spring has been the season for renovations. From new paint on the outside of the Schoolhouse and inside the Alternative Energy House, to the new border on the Sundial, to the most recent repair of the Jurassic Park walkway, Raven Hill Discovery Center works hard to keep indoor and outdoor exhibits looking their best for visitors.

After 33 years, Raven Hill Discovery Center is still a vibrant place where curious minds of all ages embark on a journey through the wonders of science, the tapestry of history, and the palette of the arts. It is a playground for exploration and imagination, where learning becomes a lively interactive adventure. Visitors delve into the past, embrace the present, and envision the possibilities of the future as they explore inside; enjoy unique events like the 2024 Solar Eclipse; wander the grounds at Raven Hill or experience one of the Center's Outreach programs.



Despite partly cloudy skies, a dozen or so visitors watched the eclipse from the Steppes along Raven Hill's parking lot, while others chose to watch from the Ancient World's pyramid or near the Center's observatory. One family chose a more private place and watched from the garden bench donated in honor of their loved one. More than 75 people spent time at Raven Hill on Eclipse Day 2024.
