### SAG Program Grant from The Hestia Women's Circle of Giving

The Hestia Women's Circle of Giving has awarded \$ 2,500 to Raven Hill for a Saturday morning STEM Academy for Girls (SAG) program. Since 1993, Raven Hill has offered a science/mathematics career expo for middle school students in Charlevoix and Emmet Counties. SAG will enhance that career expo program, providing more in-depth explorations and connections in a variety of STEM (Science Technology Engineering Mathematics) careers, such as archeology, water quality, meteorology, engineering and health services. The program is open to elementary and middle school girls. SAG will be limited to twenty girls per session and Raven Hill will encourage different participants for each monthly session. Girls can be put on a wait list, if there are open spaces. There will be five sessions during the 2018-2019 school year, all from 10:30am to noon and on some of the second Saturdays of the month to coincide with FREE Second Saturdays. 

Lowe's also provided labor to install a pavilion roof over the existing picnic area (below). David Austin of Waterpaw donated a Watershed Model (top right and side) that shows a wetlands area, waterfall coming down out of

the "mountain" and springs bubbling up from the ground, all forming tributaries that merge and flow to a "lake". This kid-friendly water model uses recycled rainwater and was installed by the picnic pavilion for all to enjoy.
