The turnout was small, but those who came to help out whittled away at tasks on the "famous" refrigerator list! Lots was accomplished indoors and outside. Everyone enjoyed a great potluck lunch afterwards.

Other volunteers came out to help individually throughout the week. Dave Clapp cut up all the trees that the winter & spring windstorms brought down, getting them off the trails and out of the parking lot. Dave is also

working to repair the rail along

the ramp at the treehouse that was damaged by falling trees. The great thing about all the downed trees in the woods is that now there are plenty of log balance beams for visitors to enjoy on their way to and from the treehouse. Jean VanDam helped to open things back up for spring. She and Haley uncovered the granite bench and lithophone for the spring and summer season, picked up small branches along the Jurassic Park pathway and repopulated Jurassic Park with all the small sculptures that get brought inside for the winter months. Boyne Mountain dropped off the Center's golf carts that they take care of over the winter and Wilson Town Hall donated four picnic tables, which will be a great spot for lunch, snack or just to sit a spell in the Ancient World or along the Connections Trail.

When you visit, look for the tip of the obelisk's shadow. You can figure out the date and the time using the labeled bricks that form arcs by the limestone pillar.
