Raven Hill Discovery Center's programs and exhibits bridge past knowledge with future discovery, bringing together families, educators, students, and volunteers in the shared joy of learning. They connect science, history, and art; blend formal and informal education; and foster meaningful connections across generations of curious minds.

Thirty-four years ago, Raven Hill Discovery Center was founded on a simple but powerful belief:

learning should be hands-on, minds-on, and deeply connected. In our first decade, we opened our doors to inquisitive minds of all ages. Our growing collection of learning spaces invited movement, sparked exploration, and turned every walk into an adventure. Every step forward was a chance to learn something new.

Our second decade was marked by exciting growth and development both indoors and outside.

Facility and exhibit expansions allowed thousands of school children from more than twelve counties to explore science, history, and the arts at Raven Hill during this time – making connections that extended far beyond the classroom.

Both challenges and milestones occurred during our third decade.

We navigated the uncertainties of the COVID pandemic, while continuing to grow in meaningful ways. During this time, Raven Hill celebrated major partnerships with organizations like NASA and the Smithsonian Institution, allowing us to step confidently into a broader role as a trusted educational resource.

In this fourth decade, we're dreaming big.

Rooted in a rich history, we're laying the foundation for a more sustainable and far-reaching future—expanding access, strengthening infrastructure, and launching new programs and exhibits. To this end, we welcome our new Executive Director, Haley Breniser, who will help guide Raven Hill as it evolves from a founder-led dream into a founder-inspired Center—firmly rooted in this community and built to thrive for generations to come.
