SMART Start

SMART (Science Math And Related Technology) Start is a grant award from the Charlevoix County and the Petoskey-Harbor Springs Area Community Foundations and provides two hands-on science workshops for early childhood teachers, as well as outreach programs into preschool classrooms. Teachers explore handson light and sound, force and motion, magnets, chemistry, earth and life science for preschool children. Charlevoix and Emmet County early childhood teachers, providers and paraprofessionals are using easily accessible and inexpensive materials and taking home a variety of simple activities and materials to use with their preschoolers as a part of these active "make & take" SMART Start sessions. In preschool classrooms, youngsters are exploring simple machines-wheel & axles & rampsand using the force of gravity, while they have fun with their own Big Wheels.

MCACA Award

The Michigan Council for Arts and Cultural Affairs (MCACA) recently took action on grant requests for fiscal year 2016. Raven Hill Discovery Center received \$18,750 in operational support from MCACA and the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA). The award provides funding for administrative costs, space rental, travel, marketing, publicity and promotion, artistic and/or other expenses. This is the sixteenth year that the Center has received support from MCACA and the NEA. As always, a grant from the Michigan Council for Arts and Cultural Affairs requires a 1:1 match, so Raven Hill Discovery Center must raise \$18,750 in either cash or in-kind donations to match the grant and receive full funding. Potato Gun Class for Teachers & Interested Adults

CLASSES & NEW DISCOVERY CAMPS

Science, history and art classes for children and adults take place year round, any day or time. Classes feature the best of the old and many new experiences. Individual classes can be booked to fit your family's busy schedule. Favorite classes include African spirit masks, playing school, froggin' around, pioneer living, knights & castles and survival, as well as art classes like Shibori, marbled paper, fused glass, stained glass, copper pendants, jewelry, printing and graphics, papermaking, felting, pysanky and clay. Participants gain new skills, as they experience active science, history and art.

New in 2016, Raven Hill Discovery Center will offer weeklong Discovery Camps. During the week of June 20 to 24, Discovery Camp will focus on Science in the morning and Art in the afternoon. From July 25 to 29, Discovery Camp will be Art in the morning and History in the afternoon and from August 8 to 12, Discovery Camp will be History in the morning and Science in the afternoon. Each Discovery Camp includes museum and animal time, as well as hands-on activities. Cost is \$85 per child per one week of Discovery Camp (morning 10 am-12 pm OR afternoon 12:30-2:30 pm). CSI: CLASSROOM SCIENCE INVESTIGATIONS

Law and Order, American Justice, Forensic Files and CSI or Crime Scene Investigations all use science to solve crimes. Currently, these programs flood evening television and are popular shows with many ages. Even most elementary-age children are familiar with these "science detectives". Raven Hill Discovery Center will turn this fascination with forensics into hands-on Classroom Science Investigations (CSI). Students might compare the density of liquids or investigate the chemical reaction between baking soda and vinegar. **CSI** facilitates both teachers' and students' experiences—demonstrating hands-on science; meeting science standards; using science to investigate and answer simple questions; and providing needed practice in science process and critical thinking skills. CSI in East Jordan Schools is funded by Charlevoix County Community Foundation through a donor advised fund. Alternative funding is available to other local schools.
