Re: Next chapter - new pathways

At Raven Hill Discovery Center, new pathways are taking shape in our programs, within our buildings and throughout our campus. Bridge construction is almost complete with the paving of the road deck over Deer Creek due to happen within the next week. This is not only an exciting road improvement, but also a symbolic pathway to access and inclusion, ensuring improved year-round entry into a world of discovery and connection at Raven Hill.

Accessible labyrinth

Classic Labyrinth

Nearby, another pathway is emerging—one rooted in ancient tradition but designed for today. Thanks to a donation from ASI Environmental of impressive boulders, a new labyrinth will be built in the Ancient World exhibit. There, we are modifying the classic labyrinth design that is inspired by the timeless form of a mother's arms encircling her child. Instead, Raven Hill's labyrinth will focus solely on the inner child pathway, making it wider and accessible, so that all guests, including those using wheelchairs, can reach the central sanctuary for quiet reflection. This accessible design ensures that all who enter the labyrinth can reach the meditative center and it replaces the large classic labyrinth design that was started last year but never finished.

Inside the Center's Workshop Building, our new pottery kiln will revive a past pathway—this one alive with hands-on engagement. With expanded classes and workshops on the horizon, the kiln becomes a vital tool for connected learning in tactile, transformative ways, as it pays homage to cofounder Tim Leach's family and their decades-long involvement in the pottery world. A special thanks goes to the Baiardi Family Foundation for their donation of the kiln that will act as an exciting pathway involving Raven Hill visitors in the science, history and art of clay.
