Smithsonian Water Ways exhibit coming to Raven Hill

The Michigan Humanities Council has named Raven Hill Discovery Center as one of six sites for the Water/Ways statewide exhibit tour for 2018-19.

The Council will partner with Raven Hill to present the Smithsonian Museum on Main Street exhibit from August 11 to September 23 of 2018. "Water/Ways is a unique exhibit that explores the essential role that water plays in our environment and society. Throughout the globe, water holds extensive cultural value as a symbol of power and force, grace and fluidity, and healing and cleansing. Water is also a natural resource that has dictated migration patterns, affected economic prosperity, and shaped communities throughout time, and continues to be one of Earth's most defining resources. Here in Michigan, the value of water as both a human resource and a cultural symbol is both understood and treasured." The community will be invited to a special opening of the Water/Ways Exhibit and a variety of water-related programs to be presented by Raven Hill and local water organizations. All events will be open to the

DIY (Do It Yourself) 3D printer build

Want to get started in 3D printing? Don't know where to begin? Join us on Saturday, September 16th at 10am for an introductory session on and demonstration of 3D printing. John Clements will take you through a discussion of what a 3D printer is, what it can do, the hardware and software needed, and a few tips to look for when choosing your first printer. Suggested donation for the intro session is \$5 per person. Rockets & Robots at TEC Day

Raven Hill's 3rd Annual Technology (TEC) Day was Saturday, August 19th. A variety of technology explorations were set up to challenge families. While TEC Day was dialed down a bit from last year's NASA in Your Neighborhood event, there was still a lot of fun waiting for kids of all ages. "Gary", the East Jordan Robotics Club robot demonstrated his skills for visitors. Everyone made and launched their own foam rockets and several visitors invented and tested a space capsule containing a raw egg simulating delicate instruments. The hands-on museum was open for play and families stopped to say "hello" to the animals.

All ages compete in Raven Run

A small group of dedicated runners showed up on a sunny Saturday morning, August 5th, for the 2nd Annual 5k Raven Run. The run included the Taxi Trail and Ancient World at Raven Hill. There was a chance to play in the museum and greet the animals, before going outside to see the solar eclipse. NASA donated solar eclipse glasses for visitors, so that the eclipse could be viewed safely. Visitors were invited to stay and make a bracelet with UV beads, a sundial, try their hand at racing little solar powered cars and make a time capsule to be opened at the next solar eclipse on April 8, 2024.

Location, location, location!

Thanks to a few generous donors, Raven Hill Discovery Center is now the proud owner of the land at the corner of Pearsall and Fuller Roads. The 9.5-acre parcel is contiguous with Raven Hill property and was acquired to facilitate more exposure on C-48 with signage and parking for those not wanting to drive up the hill in the winter. Long term plans include the construction of a Welcome Center that will provide a "lower" center for use during the winter months and more visibility year round. The "upper" campus will continue to be the major focus.

Visions: envision & imagine

The Petoskey Harbor Springs Area Community Foundation has awarded a grant to Raven Hill. The Visions Project will provide outreach funding to work with Emmet County art students. Middle and high school art students will complete a piece of art in any chosen art medium to represent their vision of our close prehistory (Cretaceous Period or newer) OR our future, as they foresee it may be. The program will include two visits to the classroom by Raven Hill staff: the first, to introduce the project, brainstorm possible research & ideas and the second to further develop student ideas & projects. All student art will be on display at Raven Hill during November and December of 2017. A three-person jury will select 4-5 pieces for permanent displays-prehistory and future—in Raven Hill's Evolving Technology (ET) Building. Selected artists will receive a purchase prize.
